'LABASSA' CENTENARY.

The Centenary of the enlarged and rebuilt 'Labassa' is being celebrated. Alexander Robertson, the Cobb & Co. coaching millionaire, bought the house and 15acres of land in 1890.

He engaged John Augustus Bernard Koch as Architect to enlarge the house, which resulted in a two storey mansion of 35 rooms including a music room, billiard room, drawing room, conservatory and stables. No expense was was spared in providing fine embossed wallpapers, imported Italian marble, mahogany fireplaces, corinthian columns and a magnificent staircase. Altogether a most opulent and imposing edifice, similar to a number of mansions built in Caulfield during the period 1860 - 1890.

However, from about 1914, due to greatly changed economic circumstances, the surrounding gardens were reduced and Manor Grove was created to access the subdivisions. During the 1920's, 'Labassa' was divided into flats, maintenance suffered, and the building gradually declined until it was acquired by the National Trust in 1980.

Since then, restoration has commenced by the National Trust and Friends of Labassa, to authentically return it to it's former grandeur. Much has still to be done as the work is costly.

A special programme has been arranged to mark the Centenary, and it is worth noting that a photo of 'Labassa' appears on the cover of the 1990 Telecom White Pages - L-Z.

'Labassa' is open on the last Sunday of every second month, (Sunday December 16th , admission \$5.50 adult, \$3 for children, pensioners and concession. Extra charge to admit to the tower and a booklet is for sale for \$4.00
