CAULFIELD - GLEN EIRA

The Victorian Government Gazette S. 97 published on 15th December, 1994 proclaimed an Order under the Local Government Act of 1989, dated 13th December with the Responsible Minister being Roger M. Hallam, Minister for Local Government. This order appointed the Commissioners and Acting Chief Executive officers of the cities of Banuyle, Bayside, Brimbank, Casey, Glen Eira, Greater Dandenong, Hume, Kingston, Manningham, Maribyrnong, Maroondah, Monash, Moonee Valley, Whitehorse and Wyndham, the Shires of Cardinia, Mornington, Peninsula, Nillumbik, and Yarra ranges and the re-constituted cities of Frankston, Knox and Whittlesea and Shire of Melton.

The Commissioners named for Glen Eira were Clifford Caldwell, Charles Williams and Virginia Rogers with Clifford Caldwell being appointed Chairperson; John Paech was appointed Acting Chief Executive Officer.

This Order came into operation on the day it was published in the Government Gazette.

Part 11 - City of Glen Eira reads:-

23. Boundaries of the municipal district of the Glen Eira City Council

On the appointed day the boundaries of the municipal district of the Glen Eira City Council shall be fixed as described in Schedule 10.

24. Glen Eira City Council is Successor in Law,

On the appointed day-


- (a) all property, rights and assets of the former Council are vested in the Glen Eira City Council;
- (b) all liabilities of the former Council are liabilities of the Glen Eira City Council.
- (c) the Glen Eira City Council is successor in law of the former Council.

SCHEDULE 10 BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE GLEN EIRA CITY COUNCIL reads:-

Commencing at the junction of Thomas Street with North Road; thence westerly by North Road to the Nepean Highway; thence north-westerly by that highway and

Brighton Road to Hotham Street; thence northerly by that street to Inkerman Street; thence easterly by that street to Orrong Road; thence northerly by that road to Dandenong Road; thence south-easterly by that road to Poath Road; thence southerly by that road to North Road; thence easterly by that road to the Warrigal Highway; thence southerly by that highway to South Road; thence westerly by that road to Thomas Street, and thence northerly by that street to the point of commencement.

FROM OUR ARCHIVES

A copy of a handwritten letter from Edward, Prince of Wales, written on board the H.M.S. Renown anchored in Sydney on 16th August, 1920:-

Dear Girls and Boys,

My wonderful first visit to Australia is nearly over & I want to tell you before I sail how sorry I am to be going & to give you all my best wishes. All of you whom I have seen have given me delightfully kind welcomes of your own, & I only wish that I could have gone everywhere & not missing seeing any of you.

I should like you all to remember my first visit, which I have enjoyed so much myself, & so I have asked that as a special favour to me you may have an extra week's holiday some time this year.

Australia is a magnificent country & I think you very fortunate to have it for your own. Make up your minds to serve Australia well, for the future of every country depends before all things on the spirit of its girls & boys.

You have a splendid example of patriotism before you in the men & women of Australia who fought & worked & won in the great war. Your sailors & soldiers thought first of Australia & the Empire, not of themselves; & many gave up everything, even their lives, in order that Australia might be safe & free. Many of Australia's women too served gallantly over sea, or others did all they could to help at home. If you follow in their footsteps, you will make Australia one of the greatest & happiest countries in the World.

I want to say one thing more. You have all been told how great the British Empire is. Our flag, the Union Jack, flies in all British territories throughout the World as a sign that all British peoples stand together in peace as in war. Think always of Australia as part of that free Empire, which has withstood great trials & never failed.

I am not going to say good bye, because I belong to Australia as much as to all the other British nations & shall come back whenever I can. Please always think of me as on of your own who will try to serve Australia as truly all his life as you will yourselves.
