This building has been 'RECORDED' by the National Trust. The Trust's Newsletter of February 1976 states -

" CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH, ORRONG RD. ELSTERNWICK.

Designed in 1889 by G.De Lacy Evans in late Gothic Revival style in red brick with stone trim, buttresses, pepper-pot tower and internal gallery; originally one of only three Union churches and contains total immersion font under the floor. "
