As indicated in Supplement 1/77, we visited the former Cromarty School and the Elsternwick Congregational Church, where a most interesting evening was spent before returning to our usual meeting place for supper.

At the School ( now part of St. Joseph's Convent), we were made to feel at home by Sister Francis, who showed us parts of the building. A mantelpiece,

staircase and several windows were viewed.

The Church, on the corner of King St. and Orrong Rd, is now closed as the congregation has joined with St. John's Pres. Church. Originally established as the Union Church at a site in Glen Eira Rd. in 1857, After a fire in the late 1880's it was re-built on the present site and is notable for the turret The minute books date from it's foundation and are to be preserve in the Congregational Church archives.

The Society mounted an exhibition of Historical photographs at the Caulfield State School, Glenhuntly Rd. on Saturday, March 5th. The display was organised at the request of the School Committee, at a fete being held at the School. The material will be retained and expanded so that it can be used on future occasions. The Service, which was quite impressive, was assisted by the Caulfield Citizens Band and the Caulfield City Choir.

Caulfield now has an official Coat of Arms, Armorial ensigns and City Banner.
