St. Quentin's School, Stanley St. Elsternwick, run by Miss Farrell and her sisters, about 1908.

LOTHAIR school, cnr Orrong & Seymour Rds. Elsternwick run by Mrs. Hannaford. about 1908.

Miss Manders School, A.N.A. Hall, Regent St.Elsternwick about 1910-11

St. Peters C.of E. School, Neerim Rd. Murrumbeena. Miss Hogarth Principal in 1916-18. Feeder school for Melbourne Grammar.
