CAULFIELD'S NEW STREET SIGNS .

The installation of new street signs throughout the city appears now to have been completed. White on green, showing the Street name, City and postal district number, they are quite visible at night in the beam of car headlights or street lights. We understand Caulfield is one of the first municipalities to use this type of street sign. They are certainly superior to the former painted black on white signs.

GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S VISIT.

The Governor-General of Australia, Sir Zelman Cowen, paid an official visit to the City of Caulfield on Friday, August 4th 1978.

Earlier on this day, the Freedom of Entry into the City was granted by the Mayor, Cr. Geoff Patience, to the Third Ordnance Services at a Ceremony in the Caulfield Park. The Ordnance Unit then marched down Hawthorn Rd. to the Town Hall.

The Governor-General's tour of the City was followed by a Civic Reception at the Town Hall and a Dinner with the Council.
