MEETING PLACE.

'HALSTEAD' in Bambra Rd.

Halstead, part of which dates back to the 1850's, was recently sold. The new owner wishes to sub-divide the property. (but not demolish the building). This was passed by Council and went to the Historic Buildings Preservation Council for their concurrence. (They are considering placing this building of their register).

Our Society was invited to make a submission on the matter at a hearing held on 8th December. At very short notice, Trevor Hart put a submission to the Council in a very able and convincing manner. We are grateful to Trevor for his effort on behalf of the Society. So far, no decision has been announced.

THIS YEAR'S PROGRAMME.

A proposal regarding an increase in the number of meetings held in each year will be put to the next meeting of the Society.
