#### LABASSA.

Offered at auction on Saturday, November 8th, Labassa was purchased by the National Trust of Victoria, thus ending speculation as to it's fate over the past two or three years. The property, including four adjoining flats, brought \$282,500. Because of the crowd of more than 400 people, Manor Grove was closed off, during the auction.

It is understood that the building will be gradually restored over some period of time for use as a museum of decorative art, This may cost up to \$500,000. The purchase was made possible by a grant from ALCOA. There was no assistance from the State Government. We have written to the National Trust of Victoria expressing our pleasure that the building is to be preserved in this way.
